Data Protection | Definitions

Annexe to Crypto Finance Privacy Policy Statement



Status: December 2022

- The definitions are based on the Data Protection Act (FDPA).
- They are intended to explain to the data subject expressions used in the privacy policy of Crypto Finance AG and its Group entities (hereinafter CFG) in terms of content and scope.

CFG uses the following terms, among others, in its data protection declaration:

a) Personal data

Personal data: any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person (hereinafter "data subject"). Also referred to as "personal data" pursuant to GDPR.

Notice:

An identifiable or identifiable natural person is one who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location data, an online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity of that natural person (Art. 4 no. 1 GDPR)

b) Data subject

Data subject: natural person about whom personal data are processed.

c) Data processing

Processing: any handling of personal data, regardless of the means and procedures used, in particular the acquisition, storage, retention, use, modification, disclosure, archiving, deletion or destruction of data.

d) Disclosure

Disclosure: the transmission or making available of personal data.

e) Profiling (see also art. 4 no. 4 GDPR)

Profiling: means any form of automated processing of personal data consisting of the use of personal data to evaluate certain personal aspects relating to a natural person, in particular to analyze or predict aspects concerning that natural person's performance at work, economic situation, health, personal preferences, interests, reliability, behaviour, location or movements.



f) Controller (see also art. 4 no. 7 GDPR)

Controller: private person or federal government that alone or together with others decides on the purpose and means of processing.

g) Processor (see also art. 4 no. 8 GDPR)

Processor: private person or federal body that processes personal data on behalf of the data controller.

h) Particularly sensitive personal data

Particularly sensitive personal data:

- 1. data on religious, ideological, political or trade union views or activities,
- 2. data concerning health, intimacy, or racial or ethnic origin,
- 3. genetic data,
- 4. biometric data that uniquely identifies a natural person,
- 5. data on administrative and criminal prosecutions or sanctions,
- 6. data on social assistance measures.

Note:

For the processing of personal data requiring special protection, the express consent of the data subject is required.
